Student and Staff Safety... Visitor Sign-In:



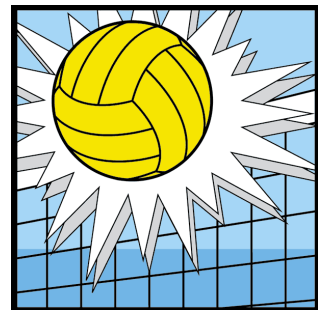
Parents, guardians, and all other visitors are asked to enter the school using the main entrance and sign in at the office. Please do not proceed directly to a classroom. All visitors must wear a "visitor" identification badge while in the school for the safety of our staff as the badge identifies our visitors as belonging to our school community. If you are picking up your child for an appointment, please ask the office to page them down from their classroom. If you are dropping off lunches, please leave

them on the "lunch table" in the front hallway and please ensure they are labelled.

Student safety is of the utmost importance. It is important that students, staff, and parents feel safe in our building and the school is not readily accessible to strangers. Aside from the daily security of our building, we are required to account for each and every child and adult who is in our school during a fire drill, emergency preparedness drill, earthquake drill and lockdown drill (for this reason, it is also important that you sign-out when leaving). Your cooperation with this matter is greatly appreciated.

Volleyball Season:

Volleyball season is now fully underway with Chalmers being represented by both a Grade 6 and a Grade 7 team. Our school teams compete on Tuesdays and Thursdays against many of our neighbouring schools. Observing Remembrance Day in the Community:



The Kennedy House would like to invite families in North Delta to attend a North Delta Remembrance Day gathering. It will be held outdoors at the North Delta Social Heart Plaza located at 11415 - 84th Avenue, Delta on Sunday, November 11th at 10:40 am. The event will provide the North Delta community with an opportunity to remember and thank those who have served and died protecting Canadian values. Local veterans, political representatives, emergency services, community service clubs, cadets, and other youth groups will be participating in this public event. Student representatives

Fall Flu Season:



The flu season is upon us, and at school, we are doing everything possible to keep Chalmers Elementary a healthy place to work and learn. All our students are receiving lots of reminders to wash their hands frequently, to cough into their elbows and to try and keep their work areas clean.

If your child is sick or exhibiting any of the symptoms of the flu, it is extremely important that you keep him or her home until all symptoms have disappeared. Scent Sensitivity:

At Chalmers, we have staff who suffer from respiratory difficulties that are made worse by scented products. We ask that students, parents, and staff do what they can to avoid using aftershave, hair spray, cologne, or other scented products.



School-Wide Medical Alert:



This is a reminder to families in our community that several of our students have life-threatening allergies to eggs, peanuts, nuts (cashews, almonds, walnuts, pistachios, Brazil nuts, pecans, macadamias), and seafood. Exposure to even tiny amounts of egg, nut or seafood particles - residue on a desk, a book, a door handle, a computer keyboard, or a drinking fountain - may be enough to trigger a reaction. Please help us create a safe environment for them by keeping foods containing eggs, nuts, peanuts, and seafood at home. Several companies are now making nut-free snacks and we encourage you to look for these products when shopping. Label reading is the key to sending safe egg-free, nut-free, and seafood-free foods to school. Please do your part to ensure our school environment is a safe one for all our students. THANK YOU!!

Dressing for the Weather:



Although we enjoyed some wonderful fall weather and many warm sunny days, fall is now truly upon us. As the temperature continues to dip, it is important that the students come dressed in outerwear appropriate for the cold, wet and wind. Here, on the West Coast, rain is just a fact of life. On most days, students will be going outside at recess and lunchtime. It is only in the case of **extremely poor** weather, that we designate the recess and/or lunch hour as an “in day”, which means that students are to stay inside and play quietly in their classrooms rather than venture outdoors. *We refrain from doing this unless absolutely necessary, as the children need the opportunity to get out in the fresh air* and be physically active before heading back into the classroom.

Not only do students need to be dressed warmly enough to enjoy themselves outside at recess and lunch, but having warm clothing is also essential in the event of an emergency or unexpected situation requiring a building evacuation. Many students are still coming to school without jackets, wearing shorts and hoodies ... even on the coldest, rainiest of days. Please ensure your children come to school dressed accordingly for being outside at recess and lunchtime (e.g. boots and a coat). Because our field also gets quite mucky and wet at this time of year, packing an extra pair of socks and pants into your child’s backpack is also suggested.



Snow Days:



If it snows, will there be school? The short answer is...YES! During extreme winter weather conditions, including heavy snowfalls, all schools in the Delta School District will remain OPEN, if at all possible. It is very rare that schools would be closed due to weather conditions or other circumstances. Schools may have a delayed opening to allow schools and routes to schools to be made safer for the arrival of students. Any closure or delayed opening will be decided by 6:30 a.m. and will be announced on the district website at: <https://www.deltasd.bc.ca>

To keep phone lines clear, we ask that you please refrain from phoning the school to check that we are open.

During extreme weather conditions it is also common for police and other authorities to advise citizens to avoid unnecessary travel. Parents should take this advice as well. Parents/Guardians are responsible for their children's safe travel to and from school. If, for any reason, a parent/guardian feels that a child cannot travel safely to school, then they should make other arrangements. Schools will be kept open except under extreme circumstances to provide the option of attendance for all, but the decision is the responsibility of each family. Should you choose to keep your child home, please call the office and leave a message reporting your child's absence.
